


## Smooth Potomac Place Sweet Tea

- Lemon wedges (optional)

Sprinkle a pinch of baking soda into a 64-ounce, heat-proof glass pitcher. Pour in boiling water and add tea bags. Cover and steep for 15 minutes. Remove tea bags. Add sugar and stir until fully


Mark your calendars! The Presidential Election will be held Tuesday, November 5, 2024!
